Leading Educational Change

Why?

In a society which is in constant turmoil, schools are desperately trying to keep up with the multiple and simultaneous changes that are thrown at them and that cause the teaching profession to suffer feelings of alienation, fragmentation and overload. Pupils have to acquire new knowledge and skills all the time, and it seems to be impossible to cover them all within the time allocated. If schools want to keep playing a relevant role in this post-modern society, they have to learn how to cope with multiple changes on an ongoing basis.



Who for?

The course wants to contribute to the professional development of change agents, key persons internal (head teachers and school leadership teams) or external (advisors, INSET trainers, counsellors, administrators, inspectors, policy makers) to the school, who can support schools in dealing with complex systemic change.

Who by?

The course is organised by a European consortium of educational institutions and university departments from nine different EU countries, which have won their spurs in the field of Continuous Professional Development and of Change Management. They are all partners in BASICS, a LLP project on Educational Change. The course Director is Rudi Schollaert, from VSKO (Belgium).

There will be tutors from the United Kingdom, Belgium and The Netherlands reflecting the international character of the course and its audience.

How?

The predominant working method in the course will be the co-operative construction of shared knowledge, in which participants – experienced professionals - will learn from each other and with each other. In this, they will be coached by the tutors. Activities will include presentations, workshops, case studies, discussions, group work and reflection. The vehicular language will be English, but parallel workshops may also be held in other languages, depending on the composition of the audience.

What?

The programme includes a.o. modules on:

- Organisational learning
- Dealing with resistance
- Training sessions on interaction and feedback
- Effective strategies and conditions for school improvement
- Discussions of participants' cases
